<b>Course Requirements:</b> <b>Continuous Assessment:</b> One written test and one term paper/written test, maximum 50 points for each. Out of total 100 points it is necessary to obtain at least 94 points to achieve mark A, 86 points to achieve mark B, 76 points to achieve mark C, 66 points to achieve mark D and the minimum 56 points to achieve mark D. To be awarded the credits, student must obtain at least 28 points from each part of evaluation, the written test and the term paper. <b>Final Assessment:</b> Assessment “A” – continuous assessment results	
<b>Course Outcome:</b> By passing the subject, the student develops his English language knowledge and skills at B2 – C1 levels in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. The student can read and comprehend professional texts from the field of security, law, and policing, analyses and interprets the necessary information from the text. While reading or listening, the student guesses the meaning of unfamiliar words and expressions from the context. He uses the language flexibly in oral and written communication for social, academic and professional purposes. He communicates with a native speaker at a normal speech pace. He expresses his thoughts coherently and spontaneously without longer search for suitable expressions. He states his opinion on current issues and supports it with arguments in spoken or written form. He produces a comprehensive, well-structured text from the field of his specialization, using appropriate stylistic instruments and terminology.
